

Dossier on the International Day of Caves and the Subterranean World. English version.


One of the hidden treasures in Cayman Islands. Cayman Crystal Caves

<u>Cayman Crystal Caves</u> (Cayman Islands), situated in a lush tropical forest in Northside, Grand Cayman, recently became a new ISCA Member. This outstanding place offers a visit through the surrounding tropical forest area and three amazing caves.

Hundreds of years ago, pirates used these caves as hideouts, and also as shelters from the elements, including hurricanes. Legend has it that there are pirate treasures buried in some of these caves. As the Cayman Islands became populated, locals used the surrounding lush lands as farmlands, and mined the caves for rich fertiliser. In the last half century farming stopped, as the population switched to more lucrative jobs within the tourism and financial sectors.

In the early 1990s, Christian and Ole Sorensen undertook an in depth search and exploration of all caves in the Cayman Islands, and began talks with the Cayman Islands government on developing a cave attraction based on the experience from the family's development of the very successful Harrison's caves in Barbados. After a few years, it was realized that the crystal caves of Old Man Bay were extremely unique and stood above any other caves in the Cayman Islands, and for that matter, most of the world. It took almost another two decades to purchase the various parcels which encompass the caves and surrounding rain forest, as well as devise a route to the landlocked site from the main road. In the last few years of planning the attraction, the Berksoy family, who have vast experience in the tourism sector, joined the Sorensen family in this venture and together they have seen Cayman's newest and very exciting nature tourist attraction to completion.





ILLUMINATING THE ESCAPE OF KING HEINRICH IV





History and significance

In this article we will talk about a special and small well of the Harzburg Castle. The well through which King Heinrich IV escaped due to the Saxon uprising in 1073/1074. Recently, Cave Lighting was hired to illuminate that important part of the story.

Heinrich IV, the protagonist of our story, was born in Goslar in 1050. Between 1065 and 1068 he had several castles built in the Harz mountains. Harzburg Castle (Hartesburd), was the first to be built, with strong walls and truly royal buildings. These castles were built thanks to the hard work of Saxon slaves, and they were mainly used to protect the Reichs Bannforst and the Imperial City of Goslar. But the truth is that they were also used to suppress the Saxons who lived in the area. The crews of these castles were Swabians (Germans from the region), who, being "self-sufficient", earned the wrath of the population and the Saxon princes through constant attacks.

Under the leadership of Otto V. Northei, the Saxons demanded that the king stop this war looting. But the King did not react to these demands and instead he withdrew from the imperial palace of Goslar to his impregnable Harzburg. The Saxon farmer nobles followed him and built a stockade castle on today's Sachsemberg. King Heinrich IV escaped from this siege on the night of August 9, 1073, taking with him imperial regalia. According to tradition, the leak occurred through a 18-metre water supply tunnel into the castle well. The Saxons continued to besiege Hazburg with the Swabian garrison until, in 1074, after winning a battle in the Homburg an der Saale area, they managed to force the king into Gerstungen in a treaty to razing and destroying the castle complexes around the Harz. This ended the rebellion of the Saxons.

Cave Lighting's work

From this royal history, Cave Lighting works consisted to give light to the escape of the Heinrich IV king. We created the perfect show light to enjoy the well and its tunnel in just one week. In this project we had to use ropes and techniques of vertical progression, including all the material necessary to go up and down the well. It should be noted that the well has water and that its level can vary.

Our illumination system consisted of 15 luminaries, 1 small power cabinet and tens of meters of vertical wiring and drilling. Three kinds of scenic luminaries to light the walls until the bottom of the well. All the luminaries installed support ranges of -25°C to +45° C and ensure a smooth and pleasant journey throughout the tunnel. In this project, the cabling was installed on the well walls from up to down until the surface of the water level. All the cables were fastened with plastic clips and bridles were used to ensure a strong hold on the wall.





In addition, we did an illumination show with our luminaries to make the tourist visit more interesting. At the end of the project that got more complicated because customer decided to protect well from visitors and installed on the top of well greed with 5 x 5 cm dimension, which made inner space of well and illumination invisible.







PREVIOUS ANSWERS

Last month's CAVE #30 was Cave of the Mounds (Wisconsin, USA).

Cave of the Mounds (Wisconsin, USA) is on Brigham Farm, which was founded in 1828 by Ebenezer Brigham, the first european settler in Dane County. Years later, his great nephew, Charles Brigham, and his family operated the property primarily as a dairy farm, but occasionally leased quarry rights to local contractors, and thus in 1939 the Cave was discovered! In 1988, Cave of the Mounds earned the National Natural Landmark designation, entering into a public-private partnership with the National Park Service. This partnership ensures that the Cave will be managed & protected for future generations as a prime example of Wisconsin's Natural Heritage.



FUTURE ISCA EVENTS DEPEND ON YOU

Would you like to host an ISCA event?

- ISCA Congresses. They are held every four years, preferably during the months of October and/or November. The venue for future congresses shall be determined in the General Assembly of the preceding Congress. General Assemblies take place during each ISCA Congress and they are expected to be held over a period of one day.
- 2. ISCA Conferences. They shall be held two years after the celebration of a Congress, preferably during the months of October and/or November. Applications for sanction to hold a Conference shall be received by the Secretary not less than six (6) months before the proposed Conference is scheduled to commence.
- 3. ISCA Meetings. Meeting may be held in the intervening year between a Congress and any Conference. No more than one ISCA Meeting per year may be sanctioned. Applications for sanction to hold an ISCA Meeting shall be received by the Secretary not less than six (6) months before the proposed ISCA Meeting is scheduled to commence. Applicants must be made by a Full Member of the Association.
