MULU NATIONAL PARK



Mulu National Park will be hosting the ISCA Conference 2024 in late-September/early-October this year. However, there are many things you may not know about this incredible and unique place.

While longboats and the visitors' own feet are the only means of transport, Mulu National Park covers around 85 000 ha of some of the oldest pristine rainforests in the world. This huge area is located on the island of Borneo in the Malaysian state of Sarawak, close to the border with Brunei. In addition to the aforementioned rainforests and their exceptional biodiversity, the place also includes an extensive limestone karst area with some of the world's largest cave chambers.

In 2000 Mulu was successfully listed as a World Heritage site, <u>meeting all four criteria</u> in order to do so. The forces of abundant rainwater and ground waters were combined to penetrate the limestone and to start a chemical process which formed one of the longest cave systems in the world. In addition, the island of Borneo is considered as one of the world's biodiversity hotspots, presenting visitors with an outstanding diversity of flora and fauna. Therefore, (rare) plants and animals are to be found almost in every corner.

Mulu is reachable by flight (no land road). Transit Kuala Lumpur & Miri/Kuching/ Kota Kinabalu then another ATR flight by Maswings (subsidiary of Malaysia Airlines) to Mulu.

*Miri is the shortest flight duration to Mulu - 30 mins)

- The Clearwater Cave is the 8th longest cave system in the World which offer both Show Caves & Adventure Caving intermediate/advance level
- Sarawak Chamber is the largest known Cave chamber in the world by surface

- There are no banks, ATM's prepare cash for local markets. Card (Visa/Master) is acceptable in Park HQ/Marriott
- Mulu has a clinic but bring your own sufficient supply of prescription medicines
- Alcohol is available in Mulu
- Two dominant tribes in Mulu are Berawan and Penan – mostly Christian orientated
- Malaysia is a drug free country
- The food is mostly spicy! (vegetarian menu available)
- Internet connectivity is OFTEN limited, please get a Digi simcard (strong signal at Park HQ) or Maxis simcard (strong signal at Marriott)

- RAIN in the rainforest is a dominant force and occurs daily, often interrupting flights and excursions – be flexible, be patient, be in tune with NATURE
- Raingear and non-slip shoes are essential
- Drink enough water to combat dehydration
- The temperatures could be in the high 20 degree Celsius with a 99% humidity

SHOW CAVES SURVEY 2024






INTERNATIONAL SHOW CAVES ASSOCIATION

The International Show Caves Association and the US National Caves Association (NCA) will be cooperating one more year in order to carry out a survey on the show cave business, just as they did two years ago. This time, we also wanted to thank the Bulgarian Association for Cave and Eco Tourism (BAPET) for showing immediate interest in providing financial support to the study.



In 2022, the <u>ISCA & NCA research</u> conducted by Core Research received 127 responses representing 152 show caves from all over the world. The data collected served to establish a baseline for the significance of the show cave industry and how show caves contribute to the global economy, monitor the recovery of show caves after the COVID-19 pandemic, and identify show cave manager's immediate concers and plans for the future.f show caves from all corners.

New details will be provided soon as ISCA will be sharing the survey with all show caves in order to reach a significant amount of participants. If you have any doubt or are willing to support, please contact us.

19TH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF SPELEOLOGY






The Brazilian Speleological Society (SBE) and the National Center for Research and Conservation of Caves (ICMBio/CECAV) will host the 19th International Congress of Speleology (ICS), which will include the 38th Brazilian Congress of Speleology (CBE) and the celebration of the 60th Anniversary of the UIS. The event will take place from July 20 through July 27, 2025.

Seventy-two years after the first ICS (Paris, 1953), the host city of the 19th ICS in 2025 will be Belo Horizonte (Brazil), capital of the state of Minas Gerais. For the occasion, the main theme of the event will be "60 Years of the UIS: History to the Future."

CUEVATUR 2024



The 9th Spanish Congress on Show Caves and Mines, CUEVATUR IX, will be celebrated in Karrantza (Bizkaia, Spain), where Pozalagua Cave is located, from October 23 to October 25. Two years after its celebration in Pulpi (Almería, Spain), a new meeting will be taking place in the North of the country.

Under the main theme 'Geology and Tourism: Complementary Realities', the Spanish Show Caves Association (ACTE) will be organising a new edition of the event together with the Council of Karrantza and Enkartur. In addition, the Congress will be supported by Euskadi, the Basque Government and the Provincial Council of Bizkaia; and it is sponsored by Termas de Molinar. Other collaborators are the Ministry of Industry and Tourism, and the Ministry of Science, Innovation and Universities, as well as the International Show Caves Association, the University of the Basque Country and the Association of Ibero-American Show Caves (actiba).

At the event, experts from different corners will meet in order to share ideas and experiences about the subterranean tourism, a sector which has become the spearhead of innovative and sustainable tourism, especially in rural regions and thanks to its natural and cultural heritage.

RELIGHTING DEMÄNOVSKÁ LIBERTY CAVE AND ICE CAVE, A CAVE LIGHTING PROJECT

Demänovská cave system was a real challenge which ended up being a success. Cave Lighting

Situated in Low Tatra Mountains, Demänovská cave system is the largest cave system in Slovakia, with more than 40 kilometers of interconnected underground passages. From more than ten caves that are part of this system, two of them are famous to the public: <u>Liberty Cave</u>, developed as a show cave and opened for the public in 1924, currently the most visited cave in Slovakia, and <u>Ice Cave</u>, first open to the public in the 19th century and reopened with new stairs and electrical lighting in 1952.

2022 marked the beginning of a laborious work which was performed by Cave Lighting in cooperation with the local electrical company Voltatech a.s. They certainly faced several challenges to complete this astonishing and wonderful job.

The first one to receive a new lighting system was Ice Cave. As the name very clearly suggests, the cave is... very cold! Extreme temperatures ranged between well below zero degrees to a maximum of 3°C deep into the cave system. The access to the cave is not easy, requiring a real mountain hike in not quite favorable conditions, as the trail is often covered by ice and snow, cave entrance being almost 100 m above the bottom of the valley. In addition, the inside of the cave is also an aspect to take into consideration, and anyone who wants to go through it is required to climb over 650 steps up and down.

Placing luminaries was really challenging because of the number of twists and turns and since it is mandatory to find a good placement in order to get good lighting and avoid blinding the visitors. Another thing that had to be considered was the future ice forming in a lot of parts of the cave, which made impossible to place the luminaries on the ground and on the walls of the cave so many of the luminaries had to be installed far away from the walls and cave formations, on the handrail and on the suspended visitors path itself, not the ideal location for light sources if you want to create a modern tridimensional lighting and avoid a flat looking more traditional type of lighting.

Last but not least, in the deep part of the cave the spaces are very large and the ceiling height is considerable, necessitating the use of ropes and specific climbing equipment for the installation of lamps and control units. Anyway, the Cave Lighting team managed to find a way to mitigate all of this and finish in time the installation of the new lighting system, together with the switching system, a brand-new light and music show and audio system for comment points. The cave was reopened for the public in May 2023 and the final programming of the new system was finished later in the year.







In March 2023, Cave Lighting started the Liberty Cave's project, which presented a new set of challenges. The cave itself is huge, including a long tour path which is over 2 kilometres in length and has more than 1,100 steps. Besides, the morphology of the cave is very diverse, with different galleries and halls, from low and narrow passages with delicate formations to huge galleries and domes of impressive size.

Another challenge was the cave's high humidity, relative air humidity going to 99 percent and a lot of water dripping from the walls and ceilings, including a permanent waterfall from the ceiling of one of the big domes (which was illuminated with several lamps placed directly under the waterfall).

The temperature in Liberty Cave was higher than in Ice Cave, creating a different yet interesting working environment. The lighting of the underground river that crosses the cave at the lowest level of the route and the impressive galleries crossed by it proved quite challenging as well, and in the big dome the continuous noise of the river over the huge space of the hall made communication between the team members almost impossible. Anyway, after almost 5 months of hard work the installation of the new luminaries was finished in July 2023. In the following months the electrical connections were also made by the local electrician team (Voltatech a.s.) and the final programming of the tour lights and shows was completed in September 2023.

In order to carry out this complex project, Cave Lighting mobilized one of the largest teams. The activities were coordinated by the on-site project manager Alejandro Hernaiz, the other team members being Dan Ciulpan, Tudor Marin, Andrei Daniel, Cristian Nitulescu, Tomas Jassus, Radu Puscas, Oleg Klimchuk, Vladimir Lyevashov. The complex programming was made possible by Vladimir Vashkevich. Installation of the new high voltage power supply, including new power cable, electrical cabinets, generators, etc. and the electrical connections for the low voltage installation was made by a numerous local team coordinated by Voltatech a.s. electrical company. The eight light and music shows in both caves were designed and created by Jan Ptacin.

In summary, the success of this difficult project would not have been possible without the participation of the aforementioned number of professionals in the field. Now, the most famous and visited show caves in Slovakia has a new and modern LED lighting system which will provide the many visitors with an exciting experience for the years to come. The works in Demänovská cave system will continue in Peace Cave, the third cave that will be opened to the public in the near future.

IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL KARST ECOTOURISM DESTINATIONS IN PHILIPPINES

Between February 20 and 23, 2024, explorations were conducted within the 29,000-hectare Ancestral Domain located in Esperanza municipality, province of Sultan Kudarat (Philippines). The primary focus was on identifying potential karst ecotourism destinations for future environmental development to contribute to livelihood opportunities for poverty relief among indigenous communities residing in far-flung areas.

For an area to be considered part of an ecotourism destination within an Ancestral Domain, it must obtain Free, Prior, and Informed Consent (FPIC) and establish a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) involving the National Commission on Indigenous Peoples, Local Government Unit, Indigenous Peoples communities, and other relevant stakeholders.

Spearheaded by the proactive and goal-oriented Municipal Tourism Officer of Esperanza, Mr. Louenel Elises, this collaborative effort brought together a diverse array of individuals and purpose-driven leaders united in the pursuit of significant achievements, positive societal impact, and the realization of long-term success and sustainable development goals, benefiting both present and future generations.






FUTURE ISCA EVENTS DEPEND ON YOU

- 1. ISCA Congresses. They are held every four years, preferably during the months of October and/or November. The venue for future congresses shall be determined in the General Assembly of the preceding Congress. General Assemblies take place during each ISCA Congress and they are expected to be held over a period of one day.
- 2. ISCA Conferences. They shall be held two years after the celebration of a Congress, preferably during the months of October and/or November. Applications for sanction to hold a Conference shall be received by the Secretary not less than six (6) months before the proposed Conference is scheduled to commence.
- 3. ISCA Meetings. Meeting may be held in the intervening year between a Congress and any Conference. No more than one ISCA Meeting per year may be sanctioned. Applications for sanction to hold an ISCA Meeting shall be received by the Secretary not less than six (6) months before the proposed ISCA Meeting is scheduled to commence. Applicants must be made by a Full Member of the Association.
