Dear authors, your full papers should have the structure below, font and other text formatting is not prescribed – they will be adapted by editors. All texts should be in English.

Title of the paper

The name(s) of the author(s) and their addresses

Abstract

max. 300 words

Keywords

4 to 6 keywords

Main Text

Max. 5000 words, all references should be cited in the text (e.g. Slabe 1995; Ford & Williams 2007; Kempe *et al.* 2003) and in full form given in the Reference list at the end.

Tables can be inserted in text in desired place, or title of table cited in text in the right place and table itself given at the end of the text in the List of tables. Tables should be made in word processor.

Figures should be only cited in text as: Fig. Number; title of figure should be given at the end in the List of figures and the figure itself attached as separate file with the proper name.

References

The reference list should be in alphabetical order, entries from the same author should be ordered by date, starting with the oldest

If not given in text. Table no., caption and table itself.

List of figures

All figure captions in a uniform list (Fig. 1. Description, etc.), each figure should be submitted in a separate file, do not embed figures in text, vector graphics are accepted only in eps (Encapsulated Postscript) format with "text as curves" option, raster figures and photos should be in one of the common types (e.g. tiff, jpg) – resolution must be at least 300 dpi, raster files of line drawings should have resolution of 600 dpi, all figures will be printed in greyscale
